



Bugs, bugs! This week our focus was on all things bugs. We had lots of fun buzzing around like flies and bumblebees, wiggling like worms and caterpillars, and crawling like beetles and ladybugs. We sang "Shoo Fly Don't Bother Me", "I'm Bringing Home a Baby Bumblebee", and "Itsy-Bitsy Spider" this week and practiced simple hand movements with the songs.

The older Seedlings had fun going on a worm hunt in sensory bins to find plastic worms to fill their buckets. They also worked on fine motor skills by practicing their grasp of crayons to color a bug coloring sheet. We also used fly cutouts to practice two-step directions to find an object and place it in a basket. The same fly cutouts were used to practice visual tracking with the younger Seedlings and to introduce a new sound, "buzz".

Lots of books were read this week including a few with a focus on bugs. We read *Bugs, bugs, bugs* by Bob Barner, *Ten*

Little Ladybugs by Melanie Gerth, and Ten Wriggly, Wiggly Caterpillars by Debbie Tarbett.

Saplings had a Hippity Hoppity week! The sensory bin this week concentrated on alphabet letter matching, pairing uppercase and lowercase letters amidst a grass-filled bin containing colored eggs to match and collect in baskets. The numerous table activities included: Feeding the bunny carrots by the number on the rolled dice. Sequencing eggs according to size. Counting and quantifying chicks and bunnies. Shaping playdough into egg forms. Completing carrot color matching worksheets and pre-writing practice.

On Tuesday we read 10 Little Ducks by Eric Carle. The story was inspired by a real life incident of a cargo ship containing 28,800 rubber ducks that spilled into the ocean, when the ship encountered a storm. Using a map and globe we discussed the directions the rubber ducks floated in the oceans, north, east, south and west. Afterwards, we expressed our creativity by finger-painting the ocean and crafting 10 rubber ducks floating along.



The spotlight was on bunny rabbits on Wednesday, with lessons on their herbivorous habits, their continuous teeth growth and impressive 180-degree ear rotation. Saplings participated in a directed drawing of whimsical bunnies.

The life cycle of baby chickens was explored on Thursday, highlighting the presence of a temporary small bump known as an 'egg tooth' on the beak of newly hatched chicks, as well as their use of chirping to communicate with their mother, culminating in a simple egg hatching craftivity. We used this activity to talk about how the chick grows inside the egg.

On Friday Saplings used two different approaches to create paper eggs, Ukrainian eggs, known as pysanky, and Lithuanian eggs, called margučiai. Both are beautiful, intricate works of art traditionally done on raw eggs using wax or scratching technique and colored dyes. They have a rich history in Ukrainian and Lithuanian tradition dating back to ancient times. Made during springtime to celebrate the end of winter and the beginning of new life. Each color and symbol has a special meaning, like happiness, love, good health, good harvest and the interconnectedness of all living things. Some eggs were even used to tell stories.

Kindergarten Round Up was a huge success! K/1 did great being the older kids in the classroom. They had a blast painting their pot, planting sunflower seeds, and showing the younger students our classroom.

First grade worked on opinion writing this week. We focused on identifying a topic sentence and giving detailed sentences to tell the reasons for our opinions. The kindergartners are practicing reading, writing, and letters. We are working on including spacing, punctuation, and correct spelling in our writing. In math, the first graders and kindergarteners learned about time and shapes. We can tell time to the hour and half hour. Students practiced drawing and identifying key traits of shapes.

The students don't seem to be phased by the temperamental weather. They are excited when it is warm and sunny and when it's cold and rainy. This week many of them were experimenting and manipulating the thick mud, puddles, and the new 'rivers' in the woods. Expect them to come home wet and happy!

We are halfway through April! Everyone is feeling the spring fever and the students are itching to get outside and explore. The biggest focus of our week has test preparation, building boredom stamina, and exploring different test strategies. Part of this "boredom stamina" (my nickname) is to focus on completing many series of questions quietly and reviewing each question with me. I want them to be prepared to take an extended test without rushing through to the next thing. We still were able to spend our afternoons enjoying ourselves with extra outdoor time, an art project inspired by Lois Mailou, and spending the afternoon on Friday making pizza on the wood-fired grill!

In reading, second grade read a fantasy story about a mysterious tadpole. We reviewed genre, story elements, and life cycles. Third grade spent each day reading articles with a focus on our testing strategies (re-reading, eliminating answers, previewing, and finding text evidence). Math has been a little different as second grade has been learning the basics to multiplication! They are loving the new

material and have been so excited to learn this new operation. Third grade has spent all the time reviewing material they have learned throughout the year. We have been doing lots of packets with make up after lunch. After MCA's, we will learn some new material to prepare for fourth grade.

Keep on the lookout for Wolf Ridge permission forms. They will be coming out next week. It is coming up quick!



This week we reviewed several math concepts to prepare for the MCA testing next week. This can prove to be a challenge because students navigate several math problems about different topics learned throughout the year. They are staying positive and trying their best and it shows! In reading we have been practicing a comprehension strategy called PRESTO to use with our fiction and nonfiction articles. Ask your child to explain the PRESTO steps to use as a test taking strategy. On Thursday the 3rd graders joined our class to



learn about how to use the online tools available to them during testing. Because of all of our hard work on MCA practice we took some time for some extra recess this week and will also be making pizzas tomorrow, on Friday afternoon, using the wood-fired oven. We have definitely worked hard and played hard!

MCA testing is next Tuesday (reading), Wednesday (math) and Thursday (science, 5th graders only). While these tests don't define student academic success, it is important for them to come to school with a positive attitude to try their very best. Please make sure your child gets plenty of sleep next week. Please continue to encourage your child to record their reading or math fact practice minutes on the "Tickets To Treasure" worksheet and turn it in for tickets for a chance to win end of the year prizes.

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
